PIONEER STUDENTS OF THE MONTH. Pioneer Career and Technology Center has chosen students Tiffany Gray and Raven Crawford as Students of the Month. PIONEER LABS WORK COLLABORATIVELY ON COMMUNITY PROJECTS. Students in a variety of labs are out working in our communities for valuable job experience. Senior Carpentry students have been working with Galion Rotary member Dennis Crim to build a wheelchair ramp in Crestline and to install a metal roof on a restroom building at a Shelby park. Junior Carpentry students have begun tearing off and installing new shingles on two storage sheds for Shelby Little League. The CAD, Carpentry and Masonry Programs have joined forces to work on the restoration of a log cabin on the Colonel Crawford School campus. Carpentry is installing freshly cut trees made into 2 X 6 floor joists which had to be cut and dressed at school to 2 X 5 1/4 to be re-installed on the job site. CAD has squared up the building while Masonry has stabilized the corner piers and center piers using sandstone and mortar. In Ontario, CAD, Carpentry and Masonry have been working with Zara Construction and the City of Ontario Safety Service Director Roger Heston to create drawings, and dig 46 post holes which must meet the Richland County Code inspection for this project. Masonry filled the post holes. Former Pioneer student Adam Miller, who works for Zara Construction, is the foreman on the project.
