REPORT OF THE SUPEINTENDENT TO THE BOARD OF EDUCATION February 17, 2014

SOPHOMORE VISITATION

Although the weather caused major havoc with our original schedule for Sophomore Visitation, most of the 1,364 sophomore students from our partner schools and Goal Digital Academy visited Pioneer on January 30 and 31st. We seem to be getting use to weather delays, visits were rescheduled swiftly without a hitch with the last visit on Tuesday, February 11th.

In spite of all the weather issues and the fact that less than half the students had visited prior to our Open House on Thursday, January 30, it went very well with a nice number of potential students and their parents visiting our programs. As in the past, the staff has decided to have a Second Look Open House on February 25th from 6:00 pm - 7:30 pm for those people who did not have a chance to visit or who would like to make another visit.

This is our fifth year for on-line registration which continues to be very successful. Students are able to immediately register on-line during their visit, at the Open House or as soon as they returned home or to their schools. Currently, we have over 600 students registered which is about the same as last year even though we are recruiting from a smaller sophomore class. I cannot commend Student Services Department, our staff and students enough for their hard work and a job well done!

WEATHER

The weather has certainly disrupted education this year! So far this school year, we have had 9 (nine) two – hour delays and 8 (eight) snow days.
