

## STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT HIGHLIGHTS

- PIONEER STUDENTS OF THE MONTH. Pioneer Career and Technology Center has chosen students Nick McPherson and Kendra Nolen as Students of the Month. - COLLEGE NOW BUSINESS STUDENTS INDUCTED INTO HONOR SOCIETY.
