PIONEER AWARDS NIGHT. Pioneer students received a variety of awards at the recognition program held May 5 in the Pioneer Arena. PIONEER STUDENTS PLACE AT SkillsUSA COMPETITION. Thirty-eight Pioneer students participated in the 64th Annual SkillsUSA Ohio Contest was held last month. Gold medalist Trevor Kegley (Lucas) will be representing Ohio at the National SkillsUSA competition in June in Louisville, Kentucky, in Criminal Justice. Earning a silver medal was Marcus Ricker for Power Equipment Technology (Bucyrus).
